Maybank Islamic and IJN's Aid Saves Lives



25 JUNE 2020 - The partnership between Maybank Islamic and the National Heart Institute (IJN) Foundation has supported many paediatric patients through the "Save A Child's Heart" Programme.

The programme recently assisted 15 paediatric patients with heart disease, from low income families, with a donation of RM500k on 24 June 2020.

IJN Makes History

9 JULY 2020 - The National Heart Institute (IJN) became the first hospital in the Asia Pacific region to utilise the smallest wireless pacemaker, the Micra AV to treat slow heart rate.

A proud moment for IJN as this was the first time since 2014, that the manufacturer of the device, Medtronic, collaborated with a clinical research centre outside of the the United States. "This new procedure only takes 15 to 20 minutes compared to doing surgery the previous way which used to take over an hour", said IJN senior consultant cardiologist, Dr Azlan Hussin.
