IJN Selected as Premier Asian Host Site for AATS Cardiothoracic Surgical Workshop

KUALA LUMPUR, 12 May 2025 – The American Association for Thoracic Surgery (AATS) is proud to announce its continued collaboration with Institut Jantung Negara (IJN), Malaysia's leading heart centre, through the AATS Cardiothoracic Surgery Workshop held from 11 to 13 May 2025 in Kuala Lumpur.

As part of AATS's mission to promote global excellence in cardiothoracic surgery, IJN was selected as one of the few hospitals in Asia to host this prestigious knowledge exchange. The decision was based on IJN's internationally recognized clinical accreditation, comprehensive training programmes, and its long-standing commitment to innovation in cardiovascular care.

"IJN represents the gold standard of heart and thoracic care in Southeast Asia. The level of clinical expertise, institutional commitment to training, and strong leadership make it an ideal partner for this regional collaboration," said Dr. Joseph Woo, Chair of Cardiothoracic Surgery at Stanford University and AATS faculty lead. This year's programme featured both adult and paediatric surgical tracks. A total of four live surgical cases were successfully performed—three adult cases and one paediatric case offering valuable hands-on learning and discussion with world-renowned experts. The adult sessions were led by Dato' Dr. Mohd Nazeri Nordin, Head of Cardiothoracic and Vascular Surgery at IJN, while the paediatric case was overseen by Mr. Siva Kumar, Senior Consultant Cardiothoracic Surgeon.

The workshop also featured lectures and technical demonstrations by leading AATS faculty:

In collaboration with the AATS Foundation, 20 cardiothoracic doctors from ASEAN countries including Indonesia, Vietnam, Myanmar, the Philippines, and Cambodia—were awarded grants to attend the workshop. This reflects the shared goal of building stronger regional healthcare networks and enhancing surgical standards across Southeast Asia.
